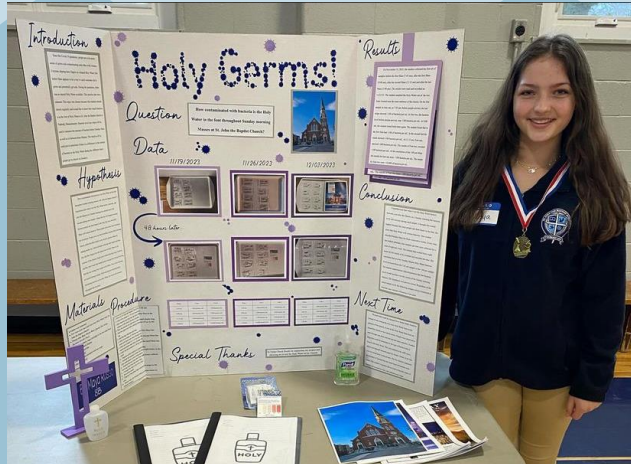

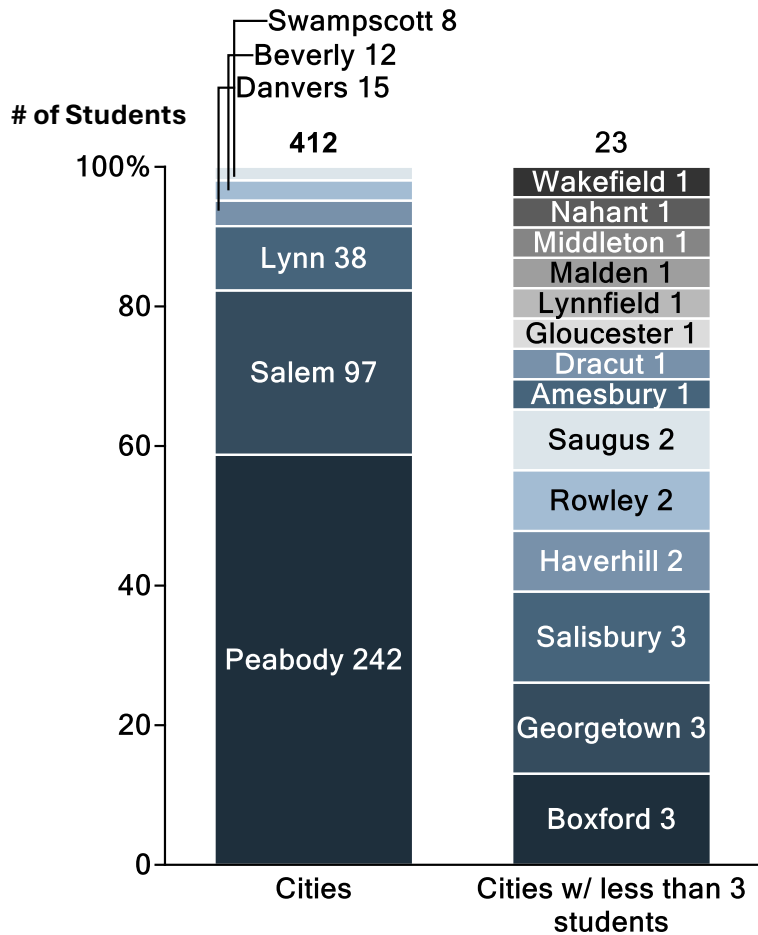

Athletics Spotlight: Cross Country

Coach Eric Wade led our Cross Country teams into competition. Our Varsity boys team finished undefeated and won the league championship for the second straight year. Vincent DiVola finished first overall, Jackson Merritt finished second overall, and John Bettencourt finished eighth overall to lead the boys to victory at the League Championship meet. Eighth grader Vincent DiVola then continued to earn a sixth-place finish at the State Cross Country Championships. A highlight of the season was the entire boy's varsity team finishing a race with St. John's last runner at the league championship race at Bishop Fenwick. Such a great show of team and school spirit.

Our Varsity girls and Junior Varsity teams had great seasons, ending strong at the league championship meet. Noelle Lander finished ninth out of 53 runners for our Varsity girls' team. Christian Sanchez finished 13th out of 59 runners and Dior Malila finished 3rd out of 60 runners for our Junior Varsity boys and girls teams.





Athletics Spotlight: Basketball

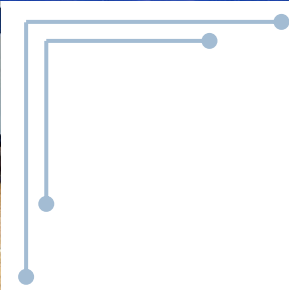

Our Clubs



National Junior Honors Society: The NJHS is an American student organization that consists of chapters in middle schools. The purpose of the NJHS is to promote the values of services, scholarship, leadership, character, and citizenship within a school. To be eligible, students must have a 93/94 average along with teacher recommendations, an essay and a formal interview.

Student Council: The purpose of the student council is to give students an opportunity to develop leadership skills by organizing and carrying out school activities and service projects. In addition to planning events that contribute to school spirit and community welfare, the student council is the voice of the student body. Our student council embodies and encourages solidarity and subsidiarity: Principles of Catholic Social Teaching.

Mathletes & Math Club: The St. John's **Mathletes** is comprised of 6th-8th grade students who compete against other schools. Mathematics allows students to gain confidence in their abilities, learn from their mistakes and teach them how to make thoughtful decisions under pressure. The **Math Club** is open to students in 5th-8th grades, providing a peer tutoring opportunity for older students, improving time management, problem solving, listening and communication skills.
